RI Legislative grant of \$1,825 awarded to BVHS for 2009-2010

“With the award of a state legislative grant for the year 2009/2010,” reports Al Klyberg, BVHS Ways and Means Chairman, “Blackstone Valley Historical Society will return to work on the Lime Rock Fire Station. Previous grants have enabled us to put on a new roof and add a dehumidifier.”

This year's grant is \$1,825. It will be used to pay partially for a heating unit and air conditioner. Making the space more suitable for housing the Society's library and archives collection.

“One of the results of the library inventory and space study which was a function of the Society's 50th anniversary celebration was the discussion of whether the present library room was adequate to the importance of the collection,” Klyberg stated. “The library is

Well known local author Glenn Laxton to share some of “Rhode Island’s Hidden History” at the next Historical Society meeting Sunday Nov. 8

Sunday, November 8 at 1:30 pm in the North Gate Upstairs Hall, Glenn Laxton will present *Rhode Island's Hidden History*, excerpts from his second book to be published in December of this year.

“I wrote the book over the past three years since I retired from Channel 12 news” Laxton commented. It is based on a series of stories Laxton produced called *Not To Be Forgotten*. “The book is still at the printers” Laxton said “but I can still talk about the war heroes, a Hermit named Robert, Rhode Island women who survived the sinking of the Titanic, and some horrific train crashes.

Laxton spent 41 years as a radio and television reporter working mostly for WPRI Channel 12 in Providence. He is a member of the BVHS Board of Directors and the Rhode Island Heritage Hall of Fame, where he produces videos of the deceased Hall inductees. He wrote, narrated and produced

is in a 200 year old and lacks the environmental conditions needed to preserve such a collection. "Relocating the library and archives to the fire station," contin-

ued Klyberg, "offered a better solution. With heating and cooling apparatus now being installed, the first step of the change is about to take place."

On December 2, at North Gate, BVHS will host the first of three public programs regarding the archaeological investigation of the Nipsachuck historic site. This is where two battles took place in an Indian swamp during King Phillip's War (1675-1676). The war eventually swept through all the towns south of Boston into Rhode Island and then west along the Connecticut River towns near Springfield, MA.

Not much is know about the Nipsachuck site even though it was significant for R.I. Indian policy.
